"Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?" (Luke 24:32)



After the resurrection, there are several appearances of Jesus to the disciples. I find the road trip to Emmaus as one of the most intriguing. Cleopas and a companion are traveling the eight miles between Jerusalem and Emmaus. Perhaps they were going home. Perhaps they, like many disciples, were scattering after the events of the crucifixion. The story gets more mysterious as Cleopas apparently hears the report that Jesus' tomb is empty.

While walking, a man joins them. They chat about the events of Jerusalem, and he seems to know more about what's going on than he admits. He walks them through the Hebrew Scriptures to explain the meaning behind Jesus' life and death. Arriving in Emmaus, Cleopas invites their guest to join them in a meal. As the man breaks the bread, we learn that he is in fact Jesus himself.

The Christian life is often a journey from crucifixion to resurrection. We experience the disappointment, confusion, and suffering found in this world, yet we know the promise of God's redemption. As we dwell between what we leave behind and where we are going, we have an opportunity to walk with Jesus through reflection, repentance, and renewal. Even as we feel burdened by doubts or weariness, Jesus will be there.

As we travel down this road, will we welcome Jesus as our companion? Will we listen as he opens the Scriptures to us? In what new ways, will Christ present himself to us. This month, we will begin Lent, a season of preparation before Easter. I pray that for us, Lent will be our Emmaus road.

NEWS FROM SESSION

FEBRUARY 2025

Session reaffirmed several policies and procedures. FPC will hold a Strategic Planning Retreat for Elders and Deacons on September 6, 2025. Required Boundary Training was presented to Elders. The job description for the Ministry Associate for Congregational Care was updated and the position is available. Anyone interested should contact Pr. James or a Session member. The Deacons reorganized their zones and assigned duties for 2025. During the February Keenager gathering, the Huron County Board of Mental Health and Addiction Services presented information on its services and classes.

Building and Grounds reported that boiler repairs are still being worked. A failed sump pump drain line was replaced. Flooring in the upper level of the CE wing will be replaced thanks to an anonymous donation. The roofing contractor will address leaks. The committee continues to convert to LED lighting to reduce energy costs.

Christian Education reported that Evan Hoffman started a young adult (ages 18-30) group and 12 people attended the first night. He is actively engaged in the youth programs. A new members (How to Spell Presbyterian) class has started. Bible Banter will resume during Lent with a look at the Psalms. Still planning a Parent Information Seminar on adolescent anxiety with Dr. Tony Donofri, Program Director, Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program. Planning has started for Vacation Bible School. The theme this year is Magnified. Fellowship reported that 60 people attended the Annual Congregation Luncheon. The committee is finalizing plans for Shrove Tuesday Pancake Dinner and Lenten Soup Suppers.

Outreach reported that the Radio Program is fully funded for 2025. The National Day of Prayer is scheduled for May 1, 2025. Amy Haynes has been invited to speak. The Worship Committee is preparing for Ash Wednesday, Lent, and Easter worship services. The Mid-Week Lenten worship services will focus on New Testament stories. Easter flowers will be on sale for \$10 in March.

I want a refund. No one told me there would be consequences to growing up. Grown-up problems are so different from the problems of my youth. The burden of homework and tests, music and soccer practices, and being forced to go to bed at a decent hour just out of the blue turns into the tasks of feeding myself, earning enough for rent and loans, and becoming very familiar with the special letters of IRS and the word taxes. On the plus side, I can now stay up to an indecent hour.

I was recently reminded of the story of Jesus and the children. I used to read the passage as a child and think: those meanie disciples, Jesus knows what's up, kids are cool. As an adult, I read it in a whole new light. Let's see how you read it.

Matthew 19:13-15, "One day some parents brought their children to Jesus so he could lay his hands on them and pray for them. But the disciples scolded the parents for bothering him. But Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Don't stop them! For the Kingdom of Heaven belongs to those who are like these children.' And he placed his hands on their heads and blessed them before he left."

So? What'd you think? And be honest, would you be acting like a disciple or more like Jesus?

I've worked many a VBS. There are a few things scarier on this earth than an angry mob, especially if that mob is a bunch of sugar-fueled, needing a nap children. Most of you know the might of a pack of youngins.

But think about the context of this chapter. Matthew 19 is just a couple of chapters before Jesus' triumphant entry on Palm Sunday. Jesus is super-well known at this point. Everyone wants to see and meet Him. Jesus is teaching, preaching, and healing almost nonstop. The Pharisees are throwing him tricks and riddles. And his disciples are trying to keep Jesus safe through all of this. They're his crew and protect Him. Jesus is going through the gauntlet physically and spiritually and the disciples know this. Then the kids show up.

I know if I was a disciple and in this position, I would have done the same thing. Come back later or stop by tomorrow would have been what I was thinking. But Jesus thinks differently. And I do see where He's coming from.

With all the pressures, stresses, and fears that come with growing up, it can be really easy to forget our childish roots. There's beauty in the simple trust, wonder, and love that kids have. Jesus knows this is how our relationship with the Father should be, and it's really important that it is. I mean the Lord's Prayer starts with it, "Our Father, who art in heaven..."

No matter how much we grow up during life, we will always be children of God.





- Gutters there are several areas that get plugged often. We are looking into getting gutter guards, especially for the Courtyard area.


