# PASTOR'S PEN: "WONDER AND LOVE UNLEASHED"

"O magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt his name together." - Psalm 34:3



Perhaps you have encountered it while hiking in the mountains. Maybe you felt it while listening to a great piece of music. Perhaps it happened at the birth of your children. Maybe it happened during a worship service. No matter where it has occurred, most human beings have experienced awe and wonder. We know deep down that there is a reality greater than the everyday.

That experience is the inspiration of art. It serves as the poet's muse. For Aristotle, wonder was the beginning of philosophy. Even religion has its source in that encounter.

Rabbi Abraham Heschel once noted, "Our goal should be to live life in radical amazement." He further stated, "Get up in the morning and look at the world in a way that takes nothing for granted. Everything is phenomenal; everything is incredible; never treat life casually. To be spiritual is to be amazed."

However, capturing the divine in art, poetry, philosophy, or even religion is elusive. Our humanity limits us. Our minds are too small. Our efforts are too timid. Our moral failings are too great. History is filled with examples of how we impose hell on Earth while reaching for heaven. Wonder can take us only so far. God needs to reach down to us.

Instead of capturing God, God reveals himself to us. In humility, he walked among us. He bridged the gap with his sacrifice. Jesus taught the crowds, healed the sick, welcomed the children, and gave himself completely for our sake. Where wonder starts the journey, love completes it.

This new year, I pray for our congregation and you to experience the wonder and love of God's grace in Jesus Christ. Like the familiar song, "We know we were made for so much more than ordinary lives. It's time for us to more than just survive. We were made to thrive."

# **NEWS FROM SESSION**



### **DECEMBER 2024**

Session approved the 2025 budget and revisions to the Fundraising Guidelines that will allow fundraising in response to emergencies and time-sensitive need. Session accepted the proposed Terms of Call for Pastor James which will be presented to the congregation for approval during the annual meeting on January 26, 2025. Session approved revisions to the Ministry Associate for Congregation Care job description. Session approved changing the church office hours to 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, with a break from 12:30 pm to 1:30 pm, Monday through Friday effective December 26, 2024.

The Deacons continue Meals on Wings, their card ministry, and visitations. Building and Grounds reported that new chairs will be purchased for the Great Room. Parts are on order to repair the boiler. Soffit and facia on the building were replaced. The committee continues to convert to LED lighting to reduce energy costs.

Christian Education reported that early next year, FPC will host a guest speaker who will talk about adolescent anxiety. The new Youth Director will begin work on January 20<sup>th</sup> although he has already engaged in some youth activities. The Adult Discipleship and Children & Youth Committees have prepared a 6-year plan of initiatives.

Mission reported that host families have opened their homes over Christmas to the eleven Korean students from Hanmi Presbyterian Church. Ringing bells for the Salvation Army raised \$872.53. Preparations continue for the 2025 Belize Mission Trip. Inspiration Station needs a governing structure or board. Anyone interested should contact Bob Sands.

The Worship Committee thanked Shannon Sommers for freshening the Advent decorations. There will be an extended prayer time after the December 29<sup>th</sup> worship service to allow people to pray with others and to be anointed with oil. Christmas carols will accompany this extended prayer time. Gluten free bread will continue to be offered during communion. Christmas decorations will be removed after the late service on January 5, 2025.

# So you think you know.....Me??????



As this will be my final "Getting to Know You" article, I thought I would turn the tables and share a little more about me with my church family.

I moved to Wakeman from Chicago in the Spring of 2000 after my son was born. Originally, I am from Marietta, OH. I am married to Matt Murdock and have 2 grown children, Collin and Charlotte.

I have had many occupations throughout my life — I was an equity raiser for a company of the Chicago Board of Trade, a manager of Sales and Operations for a capital leasing company, and have worked retail in a number of different locations across Ohio. My favorite position, though, has been that of wife and mother; I was a stay-at-home Mom for about 20 years. I was also a "professional student," attending seminary classes one at a time through Ashland Theological Seminary. Once my children were out of the nest, I continued my education with Northern Seminary, which subsequently led me here. While I remain a dedicated family member of this church, I have stepped down from the staff, so I guess I am currently unemployed - more time for family!

I didn't' realize how hard this interview was until I had to name my favorite book! I have so many; I often joke that I eat books for dinner. I guess my top 2 would be Tolkien's Lord of the Rings Trilogy/Hobbit/Silmarillion, and C. S. Lewis' Space Trilogy (that's actually 8 books). These books challenged me each time I read them; they challenged me linguistically and intellectually as well as morally and theologically. Other books I love and have read repeatedly are C. S. Lewis' Screwtape Letters and The Great Divorce.

My favorite book of the Bible is Romans 8, the entire chapter. If you want to know why, read it! I don't think anyone can read Romans 8 without being moved or transformed in one way or another.

Be Thou My Vision is my favorite hymn. I love it for its history and longevity as well as its timeless message. The fact that I'm part Irish doesn't hurt. It Is Well With My Soul is a close second. In Christ Alone is my favorite contemporary worship song.

I am so very social and quite a talker, so I don't know that there is much you all don't already know about me. Perhaps a lesser-known fact about me (but not for Cynthia Kniffin and Amy Bond) is that I danced classical ballet for more than 12 years and danced in roles as varied as Duck in *Peter and the Wolf*, to Alice in *Alice in Wonderland*, to one of the Four Cygnets in *Swan Lake*, to a sylph in *Les Sylphides*. I have a deep passion still for ballet; it is also from ballet that I got my great love for classical music.

I came, initially, to FPC with a heavy heart. I left my church home of 20 years due to internal struggles and a crisis in that church; I was devastated. My education was at risk as I was half way through my doctoral studies and needed a church in which to continue. I had visited one or two other churches during my search for a new church home, but I always came back to FPC. I was comfortable here, having known the Canfields, the Graves, the Mersereaus, the Kniffin/Bonds and others for years through family and my children's activities. But it was the Spirit present in this church family that stole my breath and my heart. God's Holy Spirit works within and through this church like few I have ever witnessed with almost everyone willing to contribute to God's mission in this area in some way or another. God's Spirit moves through this church in such a way that people really do consider one another family - we care, we cry, we rejoice, we provide, we help, we sing, we worship, we work, we share, we learn, and we give our hearts to each other. I am humbled and honored that I can call myself a member of this church and lift my praise and thanksgiving to God the Father for all of you!




The Return of Dinners Together for February! Watch for






